About Sewing at the Beach...

In January of 1994, the Stranded Smockers and Stitchers hosted their first **Sewing at the Beach**, a four day sewing workshop held in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. Over the last seventeen years, this annual event has grown to include pre-day classes, specialized machine and hand sewing classes, and a full selection of optional night classes. Due to popular demand, the 19th annual **Sewing at the Beach** will offer an even wider variety of classes for every type of sewing enthusiast.

Sewing at the Beach 2012 will run from Monday, January 16, through Saturday, January 21, 2012. **Pre-day classes**, both hand and machine will be offered on Monday, January 16 and Tuesday, January 17. Classes are geared for all sewers, both novice and advanced, both hand and machine. Classes start daily at 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Night classes start at 7:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m.

Students will be able to choose from a selection of classes during the **four day school**. A student may take four days of all machine sewing, all hand sewing, or a combination. Classes will be taught by Terri Click, Connie Palmer, Jan Kerton, Shelly Smola, Gail Doane, Kathy Farmer, Maxi Lardiere, Margaret Fain, Hope Yoder, Beverly Clement and Laura Thompson. Since requests for classes are filled on a “first-come, first-served” basis, be sure to send your registration form in as soon as possible.

Night classes will be held Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday evenings when additional hand and machine techniques will be offered as optional 3-hour classes.

Here are some of the other highlights planned for Sewing at the Beach 2012. On Tuesday evening, there will be a teacher selling night. Come and meet the teachers and purchase some of their great work. A **Market** with vendors ranging from sewing machine dealers to specialty item retailers will officially run from Monday through Saturday and be held in the exhibition hall. **Luncheons** for all participants will be held Monday through Saturday. On Saturday evening, there will be a **Fashion Show** of garments made by students and teachers followed by a **Southern Buffet Banquet**. Other festivities will include **Live Auction** and **Raffle items**.

Sewing at the Beach 2012 will be held at the beach-front **Hilton Myrtle Beach Resort** which offers plenty of classroom, vendor, and hospitality room space. Each room is furnished with either two double beds or one king and is equipped with a refrigerator, coffee maker, microwave, blow dryer, iron, and ironing board. The rate is \$87.00 plus 12% tax based on double occupancy (extra \$10.00 will be added to guestrooms rates per adult) or \$145.00 plus 12% tax next door at the Royal Palms for a condo. Check-in time is 4:00 pm and check-out time is 12:00 noon. Be sure to request “SATB2012 RATE” when registering. If desired, an “inside” room must be specified. The cut-off date for the special rate is *December 11, 2011*.

General Supply List

A sewing machine in good working order with which you are familiar. Bring extra bobbins, all feet, all cams, discs, programs, etc. as well as the operating manual. Scissors (fabric, embroidery, and paper), glass head or fine silk pins, fine line and ultra-fine line water soluble marking pens and pencils, #2 pencil and sharpener, tape measure, assorted hand sewing needles, seam ripper, seam guide or gauge/hem guage, pen for taking notes, personal sewing light, and if needed, magnifying glasses or magnifier. Heirloom sewing supplies to include: lace shaping board, scissors and anything else you may need for heirloom work. Hand sewing supplies to include: 4", 6" and 8" hoop and any corresponding scissors that may be needed. Suggested needles to have in your sewing kit: #60-5, #65 or #70-2, #80-5 (one of these may be embroidery), #120-1, #100-120 jeans needle, #80 twin needle and 100 or 120 wing needle. Example of threads to have on hand are 60 weight Mettler (cotton), 50 weight Coats and Clark, (cotton covered polyester) 50 weight DMC, 80 weight Madeira Tanne Cotona (cotton), 70 or 100 weight YLI Heirloom thread (cotton). All students are responsible for their needles and threads if mentioned in the student supply list.

Monday Pre-Day Classes

Flipped over my doll dress--Connie Palmer **6-hour machine class**

The best way to the heart of your little one is to make her doll a dress. We will be using my very popular Marjorie doll pattern. The all lace front yoke is easy to make by sewing pieces of lace insertion together. The skirt lace shaping will be done with flipped over miters; a great way to quickly dress up the skirt. A ribbon sash and bow at the front waist adds the final touch.

Student requirements: Glass head pins, blue water soluble pen, paper scissors, basic sewing supplies, and personal sewing light, sewing machine in good working order, embroidery unit and all hoops, embroidery needles, lace shaping board and sewing needles.

Daisy Box--Jan Kerton **6-hour hand class**

A new stumpwork technique that Jan has developed with Cecile, one of her students. These wonderful daisies are worked on water-soluble paper with woven picot petals and turkey knot centers. They are mounted on a linen covered box. They could also be used to make beautiful brooches!

Student requirements: Basic hand sewing supplies, hoops

Smocked Shaped Yoked Dress--Gail Doane **12-hour machine class taught Monday and continues on Tuesday**

In this two day class you will learn how to prepare an interfaced, piped, shaped yoke and attach it to a smocked dress bodice. Master the preparation of an embroidered, piped, and faggoted Peter Pan collar. Enjoy a hands-on experience with cast-on stitch flowers. Pattern in sizes 3-8 will be provided in class. This class kit will make up to the largest size. (This is NOT a learn to smock class—basic smocking ability is a pre-requisite).

There will be an additional \$50.00 charge for this kit.

Student requirements: Sewing machine in good working order—bring all accessory and sewing machine feet. Must have a foot suitable for making mini piping. I prefer an open toe, center groove applique foot #042-941 for Pfaff, #23 for Bernina or the new mini piping foot for Viking. A five groove pintuck foot is also suitable for most machines. #70 sewing machine needle and white machine thread (DMC #50 or Mettler #60, fine line washout marker, paper scissors, 1/4" diameter "Fasturn" (if you have one—they can be shared), blocking board (I prefer 1/2 "

foam core board available at craft stores) basic sewing supplies.

Cozy Cottage Calendar-Mini Quilt--Shelly Smola

12 hour machine and embroidery class taught Monday and continues on Tuesday

The Cozy Cottage Calendar is a beautiful mini quilt that will be enjoyed all year. Made with pretty vintage fabrics, each square is pieced, appliqued, and stippled with batting in the hoop. The centerpiece, month plaque, and markers are made separately and can be changed each month.

There will be an additional \$25.00 charge for this kit.

Student requirements: Sewing machine, embroidery unit, 5” x 7” hoop, embroidery presser foot, regular sewing presser foot, 80/12 sharp embroidery needles, #80/12 sharp universal sewing needles, white sewing thread, bobbin thread, straight pins, ruler, rotary cutter, cutting mat, seam gauge, mini iron, 31 Hooks and eyes (size 2).

Sleep Over Fun: Kathy Farmer

6-hour machine and embroidery class

You will impress all your friends when you show up at a sleep over with your very own pillow in a pillow case made by You! And, of course you will need to have your cosmetics in a beautiful little embellished zippered bag also made by You! And for the Mom’s or Grandmother’s in class, these items will make a great gift for the young person in your life.

This is our special class for all our young students. Any adult will be welcome to take this class also.

Student requirements: Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine and embroidery unit in good working order, neutral color sewing thread (white, ecru, cream, or light gray).

A wonderful little sewing bag with thread painted feathers and a delightful embroidered nest.

Student requirements: Basic Hand sewing supplies, hoops

Crazy Patch Pillow-- Kathy Farmer

6-hour machine and embroidery class

Crazy patch is fun and easy and is the perfect way to combine a variety of fabrics to make one of the most popular home accessories—a pillow! You will get to play with decorative stitches on your sewing machine, add laces, and stitch embroideries to create this one-of-a-kind accessory.

Student requirements Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine and embroidery unit in good working order, hoops and embroidery feet, assortment of pastel embroidery and decorative threads, cream colored sewing thread, #90 embroidery needle, #90 topstitching or jeans needles, edge joining foot, pattern tracing material and blue wash out marker.

12 Hour Classes

Berry Harvest – Jan Kerton

12-hour hand class taught Wednesday and continues on Thursday

Jan and Jenny McWhinney created this delightful thread painted scene of Milly and Pip picking beautiful stumpwork raspberries. Students may choose to work the project on a blanket or onto fabric to create a pocket or panel on a sewing bag.

Student requirements: Basic hand sewing supplies, hoops

Sweet Baby Jane-Ruffle Top, Capri Pants, and Hat--Gail Doane

12-hour machine class taught Wednesday and continues on Thursday

The hand embroidery on this three piece set (hat, swing top, capri pant) combines outline stitch, cast-on stitch, double cast-on stitch, and blanket stitch. The flowers are centered with tiny hand dyed buttons. The simple to construct set is fully lined and made from 100% cotton pique trimmed with cotton rickrack and mini microcheck binding. The top features embroidered, bound pockets and bias cut shoulder and hem ruffles. Pattern available in sizes 1-4. This set is also available in a pastel combination of white pique paired with baby blue mirocheck and pink rickrack. Please indicate your color choice in the message box.

There is an additional \$50.00 charge for this kit.

Student requirements: Sewing machine in good working order (bring all accessory sewing machine feet) Note: Sewing machines will only be needed for a small portion of the first day of this class and could be shared. Students will want their own machine for the second day of the class. #70 sewing machine needle and white sewing machine thread (DMC #50 or Mettler #60), small circle template (available at office supply stores), fine point washout marker, #2 pencil, 5”x 5” hand embroidery hoop, clear plastic ruler with 1/8” markings, paper scissors, 12” by 12” padded surface such as June Tailor Cut N/Press (optional) basic sewing supplies.

Fresh as a Daisy--Connie Palmer

12-hour machine class taught Wednesday and continues on Thursday, then again on Friday and continues on Saturday

When I think of spring my mind wanders to a field of daisies. A little girl twirling around in a cute summer dress soaking up the sunshine. We might not have a field but we can make our daisies on a dress. Using my popular Marjorie’s dress pattern we will learn how to appliqué by machine while making a beautiful daisy on the yoke. We will make it 3 dimensional by using ribbon for the flower petals. The skirt will be tiered and accented with rickrack to get a real twirl around effect. And of course, we scatter some daisies on the skirt. Come join me and get ready for spring.

Student requirements: Sewing machine, embroidery unit, basic sewing supplies.

At the Track Pillow Sham--Shelly Smola

12 hour machine and embroidery class taught Friday and continued on Saturday

This fun pillow is a racecar lover's dream! The front of the sham is made with 12 blocks that are appliquéd and stippled with batting in the hoop. You can arrange the squares to make a different track.

Student requirements; Sewing machine with embroidery unit, 5"x7" hoop, embroidery presser foot, regular sewing presser foot, 80/12 sharp embroidery needles, 80/12 sharp universal sewing needles, white sewing thread, bobbin thread, straight pins, ruler, rotary cutter, cutting mat, seam gauge, mini iron.

Navy Pique Sailor Dress and Hat-Gail Doane

12-hour machine class taught Friday and continued on Saturday

Fine machine construction will be the focus of this two day class to create a traditional style sailor dress and hat. The white pique sailor collar and front inset features Swiss insertion, cast-on stitch spiral roses centered with hand dyed buttons and a Swiss edging finish. The pleated sleeve is cuffed with white pique and a Swiss edging trim. Learn a simple formula for creating box pleats as you construct the pleated skirt with a white pique and Swiss insertion trim inset. The turned up brim of the hat is embellished with hot pink rolled fabric roses. The pattern in sizes 3-8 will be provided in class. The class kit will make up to the largest size.

There is an additional \$50.00 kit fee for this class.

Student requirement; Sewing machine in good working order (bring all accessory sewing machine feet), an edge joining foot will be helpful for this project. #70 sewing machine needle and white sewing machine thread (DMC #50), 1 package 5/8" "Seams Great" white, fine point washout marker, clear ruler with 1/8" markings, paper scissors, basic sewing supplies.

6 hour classes

Landscape Quilt-Maxi Lardiere

6-hour machine class taught Saturday only

At Sewing at the Beach we are planning to get you to the beach on time to have some fun. Beach scenes use a different process to make a quilted landscape. Kit will include hand painted fabric for sky and many other small surprises. You will learn to work with easy curves. The finished project will be approx. 12-16 inches depending on the size of your border.

Student requirements: Sewing machine in good working order, pins, med. Rotary mat and sharp cutter, basic sewing supplies.

Quilted-in-the hoop Tabletopper--Terri Click

6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Wednesday only

Using spring colors, we will make 8 crazy patched "diamond-shaped" pieces all in the hoop to create this floral table topper.

Student requirements: Sewing machine with embroidery unit and hoops sized 6x10, 7x11 or 8x12 capabilities. Embroidery and sewing supplies. Thread color options will be sent in an email prior to class. If you have not heard from me a week before class, email me for supply list and design. Check my blog at Thethriftyneedle.wordpress.com.

Stack and Whack Star Quilt-Beverly Clement

6-hour machine taught Friday only

You loved the quilt we did 2 years ago, so I found another one that is simple and magical. You won't want to miss this one! You start with 9 fat quarters-make 5 seams and you have 9 star blocks! How much easier could it be? Add sashing and borders and you will end up with a quilt approximately 70 inches square. Each block has a different center. The star points and backgrounds are the same fabric in each block but different in each of the 9 blocks.

Your kit will include all the fabrics for the front and binding of your quilt and your thread. The fabrics will not be the same as shown in the picture as they are no longer available, but will be black, white and a bright color. If you have a color preference, you can let me know at StrandedSmockers@aol.com and I will do my best, but I cannot promise to fulfill everyone's request.

Student requirements: Sewing machine in good working order, basic sewing supplies, rotary cutter, sewing scissors, #80 Universal needles, pencil, 24 inch ruler, 16-18 inch square ruler (if you don't have one-I will have some available), 18 x 24 inch cutting mat if possible. If you like to use a ¼ inch foot for quilting, bring yours.

Apple Tree-Jan Kerton

6-hour hand class taught Friday only

For stump work enthusiasts Jan has included a delightful apple tree worked in variegated cottons and silks with surface and detached leaves. The trunk is raised chain band stitch and the apples are wrapped in variegated thread.

Student requirements: Basic hand sewing supplies, hoops, personal light

Recycled Soup can Stick-it-Stuff-it Pincushion-Terri Click

6-hour Machine class taught Saturday only

I can't stand to waste anything so we are going to crazy patch and machine decorate this fun and very handy Pincushion/supply holder. Once you start to use this on your cutting table there is NO going back to an Ordinary pincushion! We will also make fun kanzashi flowers to dress it up! Fun day learning and creating I promise!

Student requirements: Sewing machine, basic sewing supplies, assorted decorative threads, construction thread in a neutral color, #80 needle.

Appliqué Ark-Jan Kerton
6-hour hand class taught Saturday only

Jan has just finished this delightful project! Use her appliqué technique to create the animals and the ark and appliqué them onto pale blue velour to create a beautiful soft wrap. The appliqué pieces will be pre-stitched so no sewing machine is required.

Student requirements: Basic hand sewing supplies, hoops

Belle Heir “Dainty Designs” Dress-Kathy Farmer
6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Wednesday only

A fabulous vintage-styled toddlers dress, this Belle Heir-inspired “Dainty Designs” frock features a girl’s in-the-hoop embroidery design that will add a beautiful touch to the collar, cuffs, and pockets. We will be using view A on the pattern envelope, but the in-the-hoop designs will fit any pattern view for future projects. A boy’s romper version was featured in Issue #136 of Sew Beautiful Magazine. The collar design measures 210x128mm, so a 240x150mm hoop is required. A 100x100mm hoop is needed for cuff and pockets.

Student requirements: Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine and embroidery unit in good working order, 240x150mm hoop and a 100x100mm hoop are needed, open-toe foot, white sewing thread, Sulky embroidery thread: #1070 gold, #1307 petal pink, #1117 mauve, #1064 pale peach, #1082 ecru, #1322 chartreuse, #1223 baby blue, or colors of your choice, size #70 and #100 universal needles, size #90 embroidery needles, 24” ruler, wash-away marker, fabric glue stick, 505 spray adhesive, appliqué scissors, embroidery scissors and towel.

Lace Shaping Board/Olfa Mat Carrying Case-Kathy Farmer
6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Thursday and repeated on Saturday

You asked for it, so here it is-an easy and attractive way to carry your Lace Shaping Board and/or Olfa Mat to class! You will learn the fun “Hot Dog” method for attaching the decorative band to the top of the carrying case. You will be given the opportunity to personalize your bag with various design options, such as piping, embroidery and more.

Student requirements: Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine and embroidery unit in good working order, embroidery hoops and embroidery foot, open-toe foot, piping foot, size #80 universal, #90 embroidery, and #90 jeans needle.

Heirloom Table Topper-Kathy Farmer
6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Friday only

We will be using a ready-to-embellish 36”x36” white table topper as our canvas to create this beautiful accent piece for your home. You may choose from white or ecru lace for the lace shaping. And you may also choose to do your embroidery in pastels, white or ecru. If you are new to lace shaping, this will be a great class to help you become more comfortable with this basic heirloom technique.

Student requirements: Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine and embroidery unit in good working order, hoops and embroidery foot, open-toe foot, edge joining foot, assortment of pastel embroidery threads, white or Ecru 60wt cotton thread, size 90 embroidery needle, size 70 universal needle, pattern tracing material, blue wash out marker and glass head pins.

Charleston Baby Shower Daygown-Laura Jenkins Thompson
6-hour machine class taught Thursday and repeated on Friday and Saturday

Laura has created a special baby day gown just for SATB 2012 that features the essentials of “French hand sewing by Machine”. Perfect for a new baby girl or boy, it features slightly gathered long sleeves with curved turned back cuffs. The cuffs, neck, front, hem and little pocket are all edged with French valenciennes lace edging. Sweet mother o pearl buttons close the front and decorate the cuffs and pocket. You will not need a special sewing machine-only one that can make a nice, small zigzag and a pin stitch. This class is appropriate for all levels from beginning to advanced sewers.

Student requirements: Sewing machine that makes a fine zigzag and pin stitch. Be sure to bring all feet, cords and manual, #100 and/or #120 wing needle, #60 needle with fine machine thread, basic sewing supplies.

Puff and Quilted Machine Cover-Hope Yoder

6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Thursday and repeated on Friday

Redefine your sewing room with a romantic take on a practical project creating an array of incredible accessories for your sewing room. Spend the day making lovely projects that will delight and inspire you every time you step into your sewing room. The cover is fashioned from beautiful fabrics, lace, ribbons and a handful of Hope's favorite techniques including embroidered fabric covered buttons, prairie points and a touch of machine appliqué. No sewing room is complete without a serger so we have made the cover fit either a small sewing machine or a serger. Add texture with some new "puff quilting" techniques that will add old world charm to your cover. Create a coordinating embroidered button cover scissor zinger to keep your scissors close at hand. Fabrics used in the kit may not be exactly as shown, but will be the same color way using Pima cotton fabrics and heirloom trims. No machine embroidery will be done in class.

(Hope will include pre-embroidered pieces in the kit to speed up class time.)

There is an additional charge of \$15.00 for this class

Student requirements: Sewing machine in good working order, #4.0/80 twin needle, #75 embroidery, #80 universal or Microtex, hand sewing needle, presser feet: open toe, all purpose, ¼" foot, edge joining and quilting guide bar (a must), white all purpose thread, 2 spools of Mettler 60 weight white cotton thread, blue water soluble marker, Roxanne's Glue-baste-it (hope will have in her booth), general sewing supplies.

Apron Blooms-Terri Click

6-hour machine class taught Friday only

This will be a fun class. All different sorts of techniques, from crochet in the hoop, multi-hooping die cutting and floral arrangement...It's all in here baby! Lots of different options for creativity and design!

Student requirements: Sewing machine with embroidery capabilities, 4"x7" hoop or larger, sewing supplies to include neutral construction thread, #80 needle, 30 weight cotton thread and a list of colors will be sent to you in an email prior to class. If you have not heard from me a week before class, email me for supply list and design.

Sweet Temptations Coin Purse-Shelly Smola

6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Wednesday and repeated on Thursday

This handy little coin purse is so much fun to make, you'll want to make more to give to your friends. The front and back of the purse are made with quilt squares that are pieced, appliquéd, and stippled in the hoop with batting. Add some sashing, trim, lining, and a zipper, and you have a sweet little bag to hold all those loose items rolling around in your purse!

Student requirements: Sewing machine and embroidery machine in good working order 4"x4" hoop, embroidery presser foot, regular sewing presser foot, 80/12 sharp embroidery needles, 80/12 sharp universal sewing needles, white sewing thread, bobbin thread, straight pins, ruler, rotary cutter, cutting mat, seam gauge, mini iron, basic sewing supplies.

Quilted Lovebirds-Terri Click

6-hour machine and embroidery class taught Thursday only

Inspired by my Jasmine this year and all the nesting birds I have seen this year, we'll make a quilted pillow top. As always this isn't set in stone and if you would like to make this into a tote or a center block for a quilt or... You're the designer on this project, different color and pattern choices are available. If you have a specific color fabric you want to use in this class a fat quarter is plenty. Free-Motion techniques, appliqué and decorative stitching make this a fun class.

Students requirements: Sewing machine, basic sewing supplies, free-motion/quilting foot for your machine, #80 needle, assorted decorative machine threads.

Evening Classes

With all of these great choices, it will be hard to choose which of these optional classes to take. The price for each of these 3-hour classes is \$45, which also includes the kit.

Wednesday Night Classes

Recycled pillow--Terri Click

3-hour machine class

Using recycle felted wool to make a floral decorator pillow.

Student Requirements: Sewing machine, natural colored thread, #80 needle, basic sewing supplies along with a hand sewing needle. The class will make a pillow and stuffing will be available but you may want to stuff the pillow at home so you don't squish the flower getting it home when you are stuffing everything in your suitcases! If you have sparkly thread you want to bring it!!

More Zoo Animals – Jan Kerton

3-hour hand class

Here is the beginning of my collection of zoo animals. We will make one animal per night. For Wednesday a Panda will be made. You will receive a full kit but only make one panda in the class ready to applique. The applique pieces will be pre-stitched so no sewing machine is required. I have some wool blanketing or cotton waffle that can be purchased or you may bring your own background fabric.

Student requirements: Basic Hand Sewing supplies, hoops

Beaded Greeting Cards-Beverly Clement

3-Hour hand/craftclass

Do you often wonder why greeting cards are so expensive? Then you will love this class. Get comfy and make as many cards as you can in three hours – no limit! All the supplies will be provided so you can just sit back and have fun. We will be sewing a few beads to cardstock, layer a couple of colors to suit yourself, then glue the whole set to a premade card. Envelopes are included for each card. No UFOs from this class but you might get addicted and there is no cure.

Student requirement: Paper scissors
